The Journal of Cadet Research: Academic Excellence at the US Coast Guard Academy (JCR) is an online, open access, peer-reviewed journal, dedicated to the publication of high-quality undergraduate student research. The journal welcomes articles written by cadets from all disciplines. All articles undergo rigorous peer review that includes an initial editor screening and evaluation by three anonymous reviewers.

The JCR was founded through the US Coast Guard Academy (CGA) Honors Program with the assistance of the CGA faculty members. The JCR was created in order to embrace the notion of academia as a CGA community, with cadets playing a strong and active role in that community, and aims to support cadets in their first foray into undergraduate academic publishing. In order to offer a continuous Higher Education experience to the CGA cadets, the JCR aims to provide the opportunity to exchange ideas and information about undergraduate research in which CGA cadets are involved. The JCR seeks to promote comprehensive perspectives among CGA cadets and provide opportunities for them to become responsible and effective graduates who can engage in undergraduate-level research.

The JCR is published through the Center for Advanced Studies at the CGA, which serves to foster lifelong learning, facilitates scholarly activity, and advocates for the importance of scholarship within the Academy community. The JCR is a “work of the United States Government,” as defined by Title 17 U.S. Code, Sections 101 & 105, which cannot be copyrighted. It is an open access journal and is freely available on the public internet, permitting any users to read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of these articles, crawl them for indexing, or use them for any other lawful purpose, without financial, legal, or technical barriers other than those inseparable from gaining access to the Internet itself.
