Command Master Chief Maria D'Angelo assumed the duties of the Pacific Area Command Master Chief (CMC) on 2 August 2024. She serves as the Command Senior Enlisted Leader on all issues and initiatives pertaining to the workforce for U.S. Coast Guard missions from the Rocky Mountains to waters off the East Coast of Africa, encompassing four Coast Guard Districts.

Further, she helps to carry out Command intent and facilitates communications and the effective functioning of the organizational chain of command. Most recently, CMC D'Angelo served as CMC of Coast Guard District Eleven in Alameda, California.

CMC D'Angelo enlisted in the Coast Guard in March of 2002 and her previous badge assignments include CMC of the United States Coast Guard Academy and CMC of Sector Southeast New England. She started her Coast Guard career on the CGC MONOMOY, then served at Patrol Forces Southwest Asia, Station Jones Beach, CGC GALLATIN, CGC BEAR, Surface Fleet Logistics Center, and Sector Hampton Roads.

CMC D'Angelo's awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Coast Guard Commendation Medal, Navy/Marine Corp Commendation Medal, Coast Guard Achievement Medal, Navy/Marine Corp Achievement Medal, Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal, Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, and numerous other personal and Service awards.
