

Dr. Christina Parsons is a Resource Advisor within the Office of Systems Resources (DCS-8) for the Deputy Commandant for Systems (DCS), at Coast Guard Headquarters in Washington, DC.

As a Resource Advisor, Dr. Parsons provides critical resource management counsel for all phases of budget planning, programming, budgeting, and execution. Her work optimizes the operation of Coast Guard systems. She serves as a principal advisor to senior leadership, facilitating resource integration across major Coast Guard units and ensuring alignment of financial operations with organizational priorities.
